"Future Leaders Forum" – Switzerland

The **Lassalle Institute** with its head office in Bad Schönbrunn, was founded in 1995. Since 2003 it has been under the direction of Dr. Anna Gamma, and it is aimed at leaders in economic, political and other areas. Through seminars, lectures etc. the institute promotes a culture of values, based on their holistic approach: "Zen – Ethics - Leadership".

With the "Future Leaders Forum" the Lassalle Institute, in cooperation with universities and academies, is offering a complementary training program for young future leaders promoting their professional, intuitive and social skills.

The Future Leaders Forum 2009, entitled "Power of Leadership for Humanity" under the direction of Ralf Steigüber was attended by young people from ten countries. They were searching for answers to the question: "What kind of leadership qualities does mankind of the 21st century need?"

The participants reflected on the complementary potential of young men and women seeking leadership roles, explored new approaches, operated in different workshops, went to nature to "switch off their brains" and joyfully shared the particularities of their countries of origin on the occasion of an "evening of cultures". They extended their perception for future challenges at global level and took advantage of both modern psychology as well as the ancient traditions of East and West – for example in daily Zen Meditation, or using the power of the mind through visualization, the use of intuition and spiritual potential.

Young Leaders, who are willing to take responsibility, get comprehensive training in order to develop tools for peace-promoting work, enabling them to implement their visions.
